First I need my parents verification code.



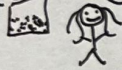
Mommy I need your help!

I need to set up a reminder for my meds.



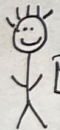
I should log-in to MyNextLvl first

Alright lets go to "medical conditions."



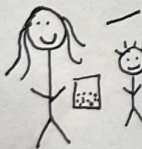
Next is the "diabetes" tab.
